Winnipeg Jets: Head Coach and Player Bios

Head Coach: Rick Bowness

Rick Bowness was appointed as the eighth head coach in franchise history on July 3, 2022 and the third head coach since the club's relocation to Winnipeg.

Prior to joining the Jets, Bowness, 68, most recently served as head coach of the Dallas Stars from Dec. 10/19 until the end of the 2021-22 season. The Moncton, N.B. native led the Stars to an 89-62-25 record in 176 regular season games. Dallas also went 18-16 in the playoffs, highlighted by a trip to the 2020 Stanley Cup Final.

Bowness was drafted in the second round in the 1975 NHL Draft by the Atlanta Flames. Bowness played 45 games for the Jets 1.0 in the 1980-81 season and he played and coached with the organization for nine seasons until 1988-89.

Bowness has served in a number of different coaching capacities at the NHL level for the Boston Bruins, Ottawa Senators, New York Islanders, Phoenix Coyotes, Vancouver Canucks, Tampa Bay Lightning, and Dallas. He has a 309-408-85 record as an NHL head coach.

Game 5s

The Jets are 2-3 all-time in Game 5 of a series, including losing the past three Game 5s they have been a part of.

Back at Home

Clinched

The Jets have clinched a spot in the Stanley Cup Playoffs for the second consecutive season and sixth time in the past seven seasons... It's the eighth time in franchise history the team will play in the Stanley Cup Playoffs.

Against the Central

The Jets went 20-5-1 against the Central Division this season after going 18-8-0 against their Central Division counterparts in 2022-23... Winnipeg has won 33 of its past 45 games against Central Division teams dating back to last season... Winnipeg has a winning record against the Central in each of the past six seasons in which the Jets have been in the Central Division... Mark Scheifele (8G, 19A) and Josh Morrissey (4G, 23A) led the Jets in scoring against the Central Division with 27 points... Kyle Connor scored 16 goals in 20 games against the Central.

Winning Streaks

The Jets had a pair of eight-game winning streaks during the regular season, which are tied for the longest winning streak in franchise history... Winnipeg won eight consecutive games from Dec. 30-Jan. 11 and Apr. 1-18 to end the regular season... The Jets outscored their opponents 35-15 during the first winning streak and 29-11 during the second winning streak... Prior to this season, the Jets franchise never had more than one winning streak of six games in the same season.

Franchise Mark

For the second time in franchise history, the Jets won 52 games in a season to tie the franchise record... Winnipeg also had 52 wins in 2017-18 when the team went 52-20-10... It's the only two times in franchise history the team has won 50 games in a season.

Stingy

The Jets ended the season tied for first in the NHL by allowing only 2.41 goals against per game... Winnipeg went 34 consecutive games allowing three goals or less from Nov. 4-Jan. 20, which is a franchise record streak... It fell one game short of the NHL's Modern Era record (Minnesota – 35 – Jan. 27-Apr. 9/15)... The Jets were first in the league this season with 65 games of holding their opponent to three goals or less and had a 51-9-5 record in those games.

All 82

Five members of the Jets played in all 82 games during the regular season – Mason Appleton, Dylan DeMelo, Nikolaj Ehlers, Alex Iafallo, and Neal Pionk... Pionk reached the mark for the second consecutive season, while Nikolaj Ehlers accomplished the feat for the third time in his career.

Hot at Home

Winnipeg went 27-11-3 at home this season... It's the second most home wins in a season in franchise history... The Jets won 20 games at home for the seventh time in the past eight seasons... Mark Scheifele led the Jets in scoring at home with 39 points (8G, 31A) in 36 games, while Kyle Connor had a team-leading 20 goals as part of his 35 points in 31 games... Connor scored 20 goals at home in a season for the fifth time in his career... Winnipeg is 282-173-41 all-time at Canada Life Centre and have posted a .500 record or better at home in seven consecutive seasons.

Road Record

The Jets went 25-13-3 on the road this season, which is tied for third in the NHL in road wins this season... The Jets set the franchise record for road wins in a season with 25, passing the 22 from the 2018-19 season... Mark Scheifele had a team-leading 33 points (17G, 16A) on the road this season... The Jets went 20-20-1 on the road in 2022-23.

Special Teams

Winnipeg finished the regular season 22nd in the NHL on the power play at 18.8% and 21st on the penalty kill at 77.1%... The Jets did finish the season strong on both special teams, going 26.1% on the power play in April and 82.4% on the penalty kill... Winnipeg's penalty kill was better than 80% in three of the last four months of the regular season.

Goals, Goals, Goals

The Jets scored 259 goals during the regular season, which was 15th in the NHL... The Jets were one of the most potent teams in the NHL at 5-on-5 with 179 goals, which ranked tied for sixth in the league... Holding the lead late in games, the Jets led the NHL with 24 empty net goals this season.

Margins

The Jets wins this season were fairly evenly distributed in terms of goal differential... The Jets won 15 games by one goal, 16 games by two goals, and 21 games by three goals... Winnipeg's 16 wins by two goals led the NHL, while their 21 wins by three goals or more this season was tied for eighth.

Comebackers

The Jets won 19 games during the regular season in comeback fashion, which was tied for ninth in the league... Fourteen came by one goal, four by two goals, and one by three goals... Five of the comebacks occurred in the third period.

Team Leader

Mark Scheifele led the Jets with 72 points (25G, 47A) in 74 games during the regular season... He's hit 70 points for the fifth time in his career... He had a plus-18 rating this season, which is one shy of his career best plus-19 rating in 2017-18... He also had a career high 57 penalty minutes this season.

Rearguards

Jets defencemen tallied 189 points during the regular season, which tied for seventh in the NHL... They accounted for 27% of Winnipeg's points – tied for sixth in the NHL... Josh Morrissey led defencemen in scoring with 69 points (10G, 59A) in 81 games... For the seventh time in franchise history, the Jets had four defencemen register 20 points in a season, which is one shy of the franchise record (2018-19).

Hot Tenders

Connor Hellebuyck and Laurent Brossoit combined for an NHL-leading .918 team save percentage this season... The duo combined to allow just 199 goals to win the William M. Jennings Trophy... Hellebuyck finished second in the NHL with a .921 save percentage this season, while Brossoit had a .927 save percentage in 22 starts and 23 games... The duo was especially good when facing a lot of shots, as they combined for a 14-7-1 record and .932 save percentage in games in which the Jets allow 35 shots or more in a game... The two goaltenders combined for eight shutouts this season, which is tied for first in the NHL and set a franchise record... Hellebuyck ranks eighth among active goaltenders with 274 victories... Hellebuyck has been announced as one of the three finalists for the Vezina Trophy for this season as the league's top goaltender.

Taking the Challenge

Head Coach Rick Bowness made three challenges during the regular season, resulting in one call being overturned... The three challenges came for three different reasons... The Jets went 1-2-0 in games this season when they have made a coach's challenge... Opposing coaches made two challenges in games this season against the Jets, going 1-for-2.

Brad Lambert led the Moose in scoring with 55 points (21G, 34A) in 64 games, which was second among AHL rookies... Kyle Capobianco led AHL defencemen in scoring with 54 points (12G, 42A) in 69 games and was selected as the AHL's Defenceman of the Year.

SERIES TRENDS

The Avalanche are 13-2-0 all-time in playoff series when leading 3-games-to-1.

HIGH-SCORING OFFENSE CONTINUES IN POSTSEASON

The Avalanche are the fifth team in Stanley Cup Playoffs history to score five or more goals in each of their first four games of a postseason, joining the 1985 Blackhawks (seven games), 1994 Rangers (six), 1981 Islanders (five) and 1946 Canadiens (four)...Colorado's 22 goals lead the league and are the most through the first four contests of a playoff year in franchise history (previous: 21 in 2022)...Colorado was the highest-scoring team in the league during the regular season, averaging 3.68 goals-per-game (302 total)...It marked the first time that the Avalanche/Nordiques have ever led the NHL in goals over a full 82-game season...The only NHL team to score over 300 goals this season, the Avs surpassed the 300-mark for just the third time since relocating from Quebec (1995-96, 326 and 2021-22, 308).

IT'S A FAMILY AFFAIR

Nikolai Kovalenko made his NHL debut in Sunday's Game 4 victory over the Jets...Kovalenko's father, Andrei, played for Colorado during its inaugural season of 1995-96, making them the first father-son duo to appear in a game for the Avalanche (not including Quebec players).

MAKING YOUR DEBUT WHEN IT MATTERS MOST

Kovalenko became the fourth Avalanche player (sixth franchise) to make his NHL debut in the Stanley Cup Playoffs...He joined Sampo Ranta in Game 1 of the 2021 Second Round vs. Vegas (May 30, 2021), Cale Makar in Game 3 of the 2019 First Round vs. Calgary (April 15, 2019) and Joey Hishon in Game 4 of the 2014 First Round at Minnesota (April 24, 2014) as the only other Colorado players to do so.

"THIRD" TIME'S THE CHARM

The Avalanche lead all teams with 10 third-period goals this postseason...Colorado scored five times in the third period in Game 3 on Friday night, tying the franchise playoff record for the most tallies in a single frame...It was the third time that Colorado/Quebec has scored five times in one playoff period, also doing so Aug. 31, 2020 vs. Dallas (1st) and May 3, 2022 vs. Nashville (1st)...The Avs were the first team to score five goals in a *THIRD* period of a postseason contest since the Sharks did it in Game 1 of the 2016 Second Round versus Nashville (5).

SPREADING THE WEALTH

Ten (10) different Avalanche players have lit the lamp through three games, tied with Carolina, Edmonton and the Rangers for the most unique scorers so far this postseason...Thirty-one (31) different skaters scored a goal for the Avalanche during the regular season, tied with Columbus for the most of any team...Only the 1990-91 Nordiques (33) had more players score at least one goal in a season in franchise history...The Avalanche were the only NHL team with three 90-point producers and were one of two teams with two 100-point scorers (Edmonton).

STREAKING...

Artturi Lehkonen and Valeri Nichushkin have lit the lamp in all four games in this series, which included Nichushkin's first career playoff hat trick in Game 4 on Sunday...The four-game goal streaks equal the second-longest streaks to begin a playoff year in franchise history, just one behind Michel Goulet's record from 1985...Lehkonen and Nichushkin are the third set of teammates in NHL history with simultaneous playoff-opening goal streaks of four-plus games, following Lanny McDonald and Joe Mullen with the 1985-86 Flames and Ron Duguay and Ulf Nilsson with the 1980-81 Rangers.

ALL HAIL CALE

Cale Makar leads the Avalanche and all NHL defensemen with eight points (2g/6a) through four games this postseason...Makar, who had 10 points through his first four playoff contests in 2022, is the second defenseman in NHL history with eight points through four games in a postseason multiple times, joining Bobby Orr (1971 and 1972)...Makar has 73 points (18g/55a) in 65 career playoff games, the second-highest points/game average (1.12) by a defenseman in Stanley Cup Playoff history behind only Bobby Orr...Makar, who in Game 1 passed Sandis Ozolinsh (65) for the most career postseason points by a defender in franchise history, is currently tied with Ozolinsh for the most goals with 18.

The Avalanche's power play is 6-for-15 (40%) through the first four games this postseason, including a 4-for-10 mark over the past two contests...The Avalanche ranked fifth in power-play percentage (24.5%) during the regular season, the club's first top-five finish since 2013-14 (fifth)...It marked Colorado's sixth top-10 ranking in the last seven years.

PK OK TOO

The Avalanche's penalty-kill unit went 4-for-4 in Sunday's Game 4 victory and has given up only one power-play goal in the last three contests (8/9, 88.9%).

COMEBACK KIDS AT IT AGAIN

Miles Wood's first-period tally in Game 1 was the franchise's 1,000th playoff goal...Anton Stastny scored the first playoff marker for Quebec back on April 8, 1981 in Philadelphia, while Peter Forsberg registered the first for Colorado on April 16, 1996 against Vancouver at McNichols Arena...Forsberg also had the 500th franchise playoff tally on May 27, 2000 at Dallas.

SPEAKING OF 1,000

Nathan MacKinnon's first-period goal in Game 1 was his 1,000th career point including both the regular season and playoffs...He now has 1,006 points (381g/625a) in 872 combined games.

PLAYOFF EXPERIENCE

The Avalanche's current roster features a combined 1,191 games of playoff experience...The Avs carry 14 Stanley Cup winners on their roster, second most behind Vegas (27)...Here's a look at the Avalanche's current roster by postseason games played.

Artturi Lehkonen has four career series-clinching goals, tops among active players and two back of the all-time record shared by Mike Bossy (6) and Ken Linseman (6)...Lehkonen scored the series clinching OT goal to send his team to the Stanley Cup Final in both 2021 with Montreal (vs. Vegas) and 2022 with Colorado (vs. Edmonton)...He also scored the series-clinching tally in the 2022 Stanley Cup Final against Tampa Bay.

PLAYOFF OVERTIME

Colorado/Quebec is 46-34 all-time in playoff overtime, 36-25 since relocating...The Avalanche were 0-1 in OT games last spring after finishing 5-1 in overtime games on their way to the 2022 Stanley Cup two years ago...Six current players have scored a playoff OT goal:

AVS POST THIRD STRAIGHT 50-WIN/100-POINT CAMPAIGN

The Avalanche finished the regular season 50-25-7 (107 points), reaching 50 wins and 100 points for a franchise-record third straight year...Colorado had the NHL's best home record at 31-9-1 and finished 19-16-6 on the road.

RECORD-BREAKING SEASON FOR MACKINNON

Nathan MacKinnon finished second in league scoring with 140 points (51g/89a) in 82 games, breaking the single-season franchise scoring record of 139 points set by Peter Stastny in 1981-82...MacKinnon reached the 50-goal plateau for the first time in his career and his 87 helpers were also a personal best and the most in a season since the Avalanche relocated...Nathan is just the second NHL player in the last 25 years to reach 50+ goals and 85+ assists in a season, joining Connor McDavid in 2022-23 (64g/89a)...MacKinnon notched a league-leading 44 multi-point games, breaking Peter Stastny's franchise record of 42 set in 1981-82, and 92 even-strength points, topping Stastny's record of 90 from 1982-83.

DYNAMIC DUO

The Avalanche were the first NHL team to have a 50-goal forward (Nathan MacKinnon, 51) and 20-goal defenseman (Cale Makar, 21) since the 2008-09 Washington Capitals, who featured Alex Ovechkin (56) and Mike Green (23).

RECORD SEASON FOR MAKAR

Cale Makar finished second among NHL defensemen with 90 points, the most by a rearguard in a single season in franchise history...Cale broke his own record of 86 set during his Norris Trophy-winning campaign of 2021-22...Cale is the 12th defenseman in NHL history (29th instance) to reach 90 points in a season...Makar's 69 helpers were also a franchise record for a defender, topping the previous mark of 62 set by Steve Duchesne in 1992-93...Makar surpassed the 20-goal mark for the second time in his career (28 in 2021-22), the first defenseman in Avalanche/Nordiques history to have two 20-goal campaigns...His 1.17 points-per-game average this year led all blueliners, and he was second in goals and assists...Cale's 27 multi-point games ranked first among all rearguards and set a single-season franchise record for a D-man.

GRAND CENTRAL

The Avs finished 16-8-2 against Central Division teams this season, which included a 12-3-1 mark in their last 16 games.

THE DEFENSE RESTS

The Avalanche featured the NHL's highest-scoring blueline for the fourth consecutive season, as Colorado's defensemen led all teams in both goals (62) and points (241) in 2023-24...The Avalanche became the first team to lead all clubs in points from defensemen in four straight years since the Calgary Flames did it for five straight years from 1986-87 to 1990-91...Colorado's 241 points from the backend are the most in franchise history, while the 62 goals tied the franchise mark set in 2021-22.

LET'S PUT IT TO BED(NAR)

Jared Bednar led the Avalanche to their seventh consecutive playoff appearance in 2023-24, the longest active streak in the Western Conference and tied for the third-longest active stretch in the league...Bednar is the winningest coach in franchise history with a 341-217-60 (.600) record in 618 games...Jared's 341 regular-season wins rank 49th on the NHL's all-time list and are the 23rd-most victories by a coach for a single franchise...Bednar recorded his 300th win on Nov. 13 in Seattle, tying Mike Keenan as the 12th fastest to hit the 300 mark (550 games)...Colorado's March 6 victory over the Red Wings was Bednar's 600th career game as an NHL head coach...After posting a 135-132-33 (.505) record in his first 300 games, Bednar amassed a 195-80-25 (.692) ledger in his next 300.

MORE ON THE HEAD COACH

Hired on Aug. 25, 2016, Jared Bednar is in his eighth season behind the Avalanche bench and is the third-longest tenured coach in the NHL following Tampa's Jon Cooper (March 25, 2013) and Pittsburgh's Mike Sullivan (Dec. 12, 2015)...The only individual to win a championship in the NHL, AHL and ECHL as a head coach, Bednar signed a three-year contract extension through 2026-27 on March 21, 2023.

HOME, SWEET HOME

Nathan MacKinnon recorded a point in each of the first 35 home games this season, the second-longest home scoring streak in NHL history...Only Wayne Gretzky, who found the scoresheet in all 40 home contests in 1988-89, had a longer such run...MacKinnon also posted a 21-game home assist streak, one short of the NHL record set by Nikita Kucherov in 2022-23.

TWO STREAKS ARE BETTER THAN ONE

Nathan MacKinnon recorded two 19-game point streaks in 2023-24, the longest streaks in the NHL this season...He is the first player in NHL history to register two different point streaks of at least 19 games in the same season...Nathan became first NHL player to finish with the top-two point streaks in a single campaign since Robert Lang in 2003-04.

JUST AN OLD SWEET SONG, KEEPS GEORGIEV ON MY MIND

Alexandar Georgiev led the NHL with 38 wins after sharing the league lead with 40 victories in 2022-23...He became just the fourth goaltender since 1980 to lead the NHL in wins in back-to-back seasons, joining Braden Holtby (2015-17), Andrei Vasilevskiy (five straight, 2017-22) and Martin Brodeur twice (four straight, 2002-07 and four straight, 1997-2001)...Georgiev is the only netminder in franchise history to lead the league in wins twice

and his 78 victories with Colorado are the most in a two-year span in club history...The Ruse, Bulgaria, native joined Patrick Roy (seven times) as the only goalies in franchise history to record multiple 30-win seasons...Georgiev appeared in a career-high 63 games—second most in the NHL—and led the league in minutes (3,638) ...He ranked second among netminders in starts (62) and was fifth in saves (1588).

IRONMEN

Devon Toews and Nathan MacKinnon were the only Avalanche players to appear in all 82 games this season...Toews extended his ironman streak to 158 consecutive games, the longest streak of his career, while MacKinnon has dressed in 130 straight contests...Casey Mittelstadt, who joined the Avalanche in March, has appeared in 195 contests in a row...Mikko Rantanen saw his career-high streak of 161 consecutive games come to an end when he left the April 5th contest at Edmonton due to a head injury...Zach Parise had his ironman streak of 180 games halted after getting injured on March 6 against Detroit.

JUSTUS IS SERVED

Justus Annunen, who agreed to a two-year contract extension on March 26, appeared in 14 games (12 starts) with the Avalanche this season, posting an 8-4-1 record with a 2.25 goals-against average, .928 save percentage and two shutouts...His .928 Sv% and 2.25 GAA ranked first among all rookies who appeared in at least 10 games...Annunen blanked the Blackhawks in back-to-back starts, Feb. 29 at Chicago (5-0) and March 4 vs. Chicago (also 5-0), becoming the first rookie netminder in franchise history to record consecutive shutouts...Annunen's 37 saves on March 4 tied the franchise record for the most stops by a rookie goaltender in a shutout, matching Marc Denis' effort from Nov. 3, 1999 vs. St. Louis...Annunen had a scoreless streak of 123 minutes, 24 seconds from Feb. 29–March 12, the third-longest stretch by a rookie in franchise history behind Calvin Pickard (149:24) in 2014-15 and Jonas Johansson (124:41) in 2020-21.
