- Nick Schmaltz registered an assist tonight, giving him six points in his last six games at Delta Center (3/20-4/5: 1g, 5a).
- With his assist tonight, Dylan Guenther has now found the scoresheet in six of his last eight contests at Delta Center (3/10-4/5: 3g, 4a).
- With assists on Kevin Stenlund's second-period goal tonight, John Marino (3a) and Mikhail Sergachev (1g, 2a) have both tallied three points over their last four games (3/30-4/5).
- Nick Bjugstad scored an empty-net goal to seal tonight's win, marking his first goal since 1/14 vs. MTL.

ON CLOUD 9

- **Clayton Keller** posted two points (1g, 1a) tonight for his team-high 19th multi-point game in 2024-25, matching his total from last season. He recorded two or more points in a career-high 22 contests with the Coyotes in 2022-23.
- Keller opened the scoring on the power play, and his 26 goals are now tied with **Dylan Guenther** for the team lead. His eight power-play tallies have also passed **Logan Cooley** for the second-most of any Utah skater (Guenter: 12).
- He has now registered 29 points in 23 games at Delta Center in 2025 (1/8-4/5: 6g, 23a), marking the fifth-most home points of any NHL skater this calendar year.
- Keller has set new career highs in power-play assists (26) and power-play points (34) this season, and he entered tonight's game ranked tied for ninth among all NHL skaters in power-play scoring. He leads the league in both power-play assists (22) and power-play points (29) since 12/8.

FORTUNE 500

- With his assist on **Barrett Hayton**'s goal tonight, **Clayton Keller** earned his 500th career NHL point.
- Selected seventh overall in the 2016 NHL Draft, he became the fourth player from that class to reach the milestone, alongside Auston Matthews (TOR, 1st overall), Matthew Tkachuk (CGY/FLA) and Alex DeBrincat (CHI/OTT/DET).
- At 26 years and 250 days old, Keller also became the fourth-youngest active American-born player to tally his 500th point, trailing only Matthews (TOR: 25-108), Tkachuk (FLA: 25-328) and Patrick Kane (CHI: 25-341).
- A native of Chesterfield, Mo., he joined Pat LaFontaine (NYI/BUF/NYR, 1984-98: 468-545–1,013 in 865 GP) as just the second Missouri native to eclipse the 500-point mark.

MAKING THEM PAY

- Clayton Keller and Barrett Hayton have each scored on the power play tonight, as Utah has scored multiple power-play goals in a single contest for the first time since 2/27 vs. MIN.
- Utah has now converted on the man-advantage in back-to-back games (also 4/3 vs. LAK: 1-for-3) after scoring on the power play just once over its previous 10 contests (3/14-4/1: 1-for-24).

HAYTERS GONNA HAYT

- Barrett Hayton tallied two points (1g, 1a) tonight for his 11th multi-point outing of the season.
- He has now matched his career highs in goals (19), assists (24) and points (43), all of which were set with Arizona in 2022-23 (82 GP).
- Hayton has earned three points in his last three games (4/1-4/5: 2g, 1a), and 25 of his 43 points have come over his last 34 contests (1/16-4/5: 11g, 14a).

HOW SWEDE IT IS

- **Kevin Stenlund** tallied two points (1g, 1a) tonight for his second multi-point game in 2024-25 and his first such performance at Delta Center (also 3/14 at SEA: 1g, 1a).
- He increased his career-high totals in goals (13) and points (24), and he has now posted 11 points in his last 17 games (3/1-4/5: 6g, 5a). Stenlund has also found the scoresheet in four of his last six games at Delta Center (3/20-4/5: 3g, 1a).
- He previously played 54 games with the Jets in 2022-23, recording nine points (6g, 3a).

VEGGIE TALES

- Karel Veimelka made his career-high 20th straight start tonight, improving to 11-6-3 dating back to 2/23 vs. VAN.
- He stopped 32 of 33 shots faced tonight, allowing one goal for the second time in three starts (also 4/1 vs. CGY: 33/34). He has also allowed two or fewer goals in four of his last five appearances (3/28-4/5), posting a 3-1-1 record, 1.78 goals-against average and .983 save percentage over that span.
- Vejmelka's streak of starts is the longest by any NHL goaltender over the past six seasons (2019-25), since Darcy Kuemper started 22 consecutive contests for Arizona from 2/9/19-4/4/19 (13-6-3).

STAYING IN

- Utah continued a five-game homestand tonight, ahead of matchups with SEA (4/8) and NSH (4/10).
- With tonight's win, Utah has now earned a point in 14 of its last 18 games at Delta Center (1/18-4/5: 11-4-3).

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Utah went 2-for-3 on the power play tonight and is now 48-for-215 (22.3%) on the man advantage in 2024-25. Utah was also 3-for-4 on the penalty kill and is now 187-for-231 (81.0%) on the kill this season.
- Winnipeg went 1-for-4 on the power play tonight and is now 61-for-208 (29.3%) on the man advantage in 2024-25. The Jets were also 1-for-3 on the penalty kill and are now 152-for-192 (79.2%) on the kill this season.
